





Live Listen — If someone you love has a hard time hearing someone talking or even a TV show, turn on this feature (create a shortcut) and turn your iPhone into a wireless microphone. Great for crowded spaces also.



Sound Recognition —Boiling water in the tea kettle? Miss the doorbell or the telephone ring? Turn on this feature and your phone (Android & iOS) will listen for these things and alert your device and/or watch.



Closed Captioning —Combines audio with a visual, providing more support if you or your loved one struggles to understand what is being said in a video whether it is due to hard of hearing, background noise, or an unfamiliar accent.



Type to Siri — Ever want to use Siri without using your voice? Get SIRI to be your personal assistant, but you don't have to speak.




Visual Flash for Alerts — Use your phone's camera flash as an extra alert for notifications. Can also be useful if you don't want to interrupt others.









Type to Siri

Type to Siri — Ever want to use Siri without using your voice? Get SIRI to be your personal assistant, but you don't have to speak. Turn on this setting and the keyboard pops up allowing you ask Siri would you normally would with your voice.








Use Native and Third Party Apps


RogerVoice - uses Live transcribe on any call


AVA - Live Transcription


TAPSOS - Contact emergency services without needing to speak




